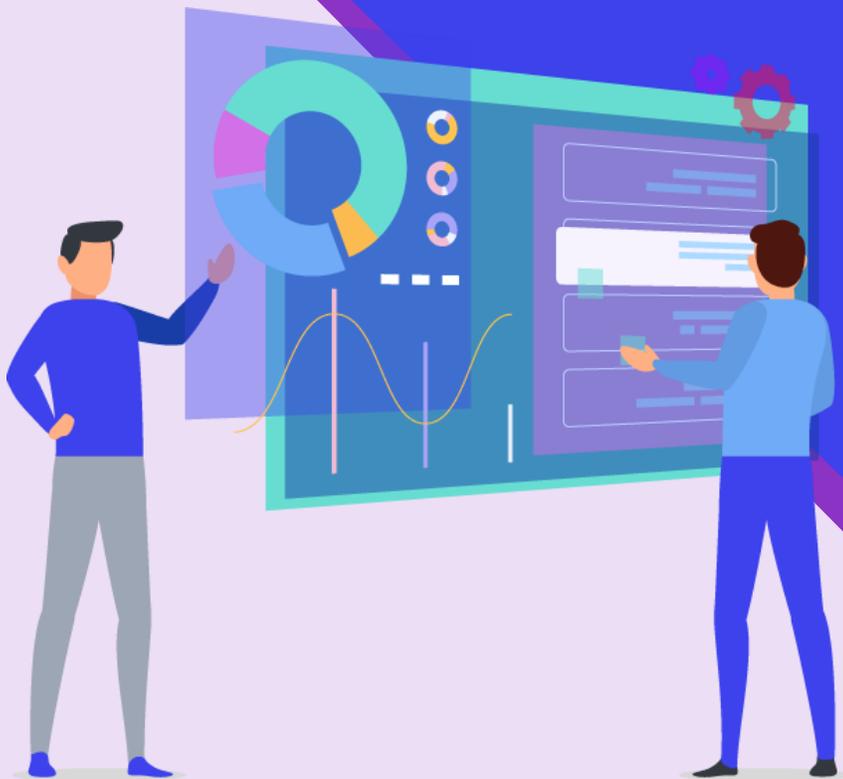

[Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System \(IPEDS\)](#)

This system that collects information from every college, university, and technical or vocational institution in United States. IPEDS examines movements in postsecondary education in the United States regarding the number of students enrolled, financial aid used, staff employed, dollar expenditures, and degrees and certificates that are earned.



[U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics](#)

The federal agency that is responsible for evaluation of labor market activity, working conditions, and price changes in the economy with the goal to provide information to support public and private decision making. Data provided from this agency is factual, transparent, confidential, accurate, objective, and relevant.



[Emsi](#)

Emsi provides data that is collected from a large pool of various government sources, job postings, online profiles, and resumes.
